Analysis to Aid Public Comment In the Matter of Music Teachers National Association, Inc. 1310118

The Federal Trade Commission Commission has accepted, subject to final approval, an Agreement Containing Consent ("Consent Agreement from the Music Teachers National Association, Inchereinafte MTNA"). The Commission's complaint ("Complaint") alleges that MTNA, acting as a combination of its members and in agreement with at least some of its members, restræd competition among its members and others in violation of Section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, as amended, 15 U.S.C. § 45, by adopting and maintaining a provision in its Code of Ethics that restrains solicitation of teaching.work

Under the terms of the proposed Consent Agreement, MTNAquisired to cease and desist from restricting solicitation among its members, anetopisired to disaffiliate any music teachers associationat adopt or maintain provisions in its code of ethics or similar documents that restrain solicitation, advertising, or pricedatedcompetition.

The Commission anticipates that the competitive issues described in the Complaint will be resolved by accepting the proposed order, subject to final approval, contained in the Consent Agreement. The proposed Consent Agreement has been placed on the public record for 30 days for receipt of comments from interested members of the public. Comments received during this period will become part of the public record. After 30 days, the Commission will review the Consent Agreement again antitle comments received, and will decide whether it should withdraw from the Consent Agreement or make final the accompanying Decision and Order ("the Proposed Order").

The purpose of this Analysis to Aid Public Comment is to invite and facilitate public comment. It is not intended to constitute an official interpretation of the proposed Consent Agreement and accompanyin groposed Order or in any way to modify their terms.

The Consent Agreement is for settlement purposes only and does not constitute an admission by MTNA that the law has been violated as alleged in the Complaint or that the facts alleged in the Complaint, other than jurisdictional facts, are true.

I. The Complaint

The Complaint makes the following allegations.

A. The Respondent

MTNA is a nonprofit professional association of more than 20,000 music teachers. Many of MTNA's members provide musteaching services for a fee, or are employed at schools, universities and music studios as music teachers. Respondent has over 500 state and local music teachers associations as affiliates, including for each state. Members of MTNA affiliates are also members of MTNA.
