Web One's solid financial performance and growth rate indicate that it will be able to compete vigorously as a provider of cable broadband ISP service in TWC's Kansas City division.

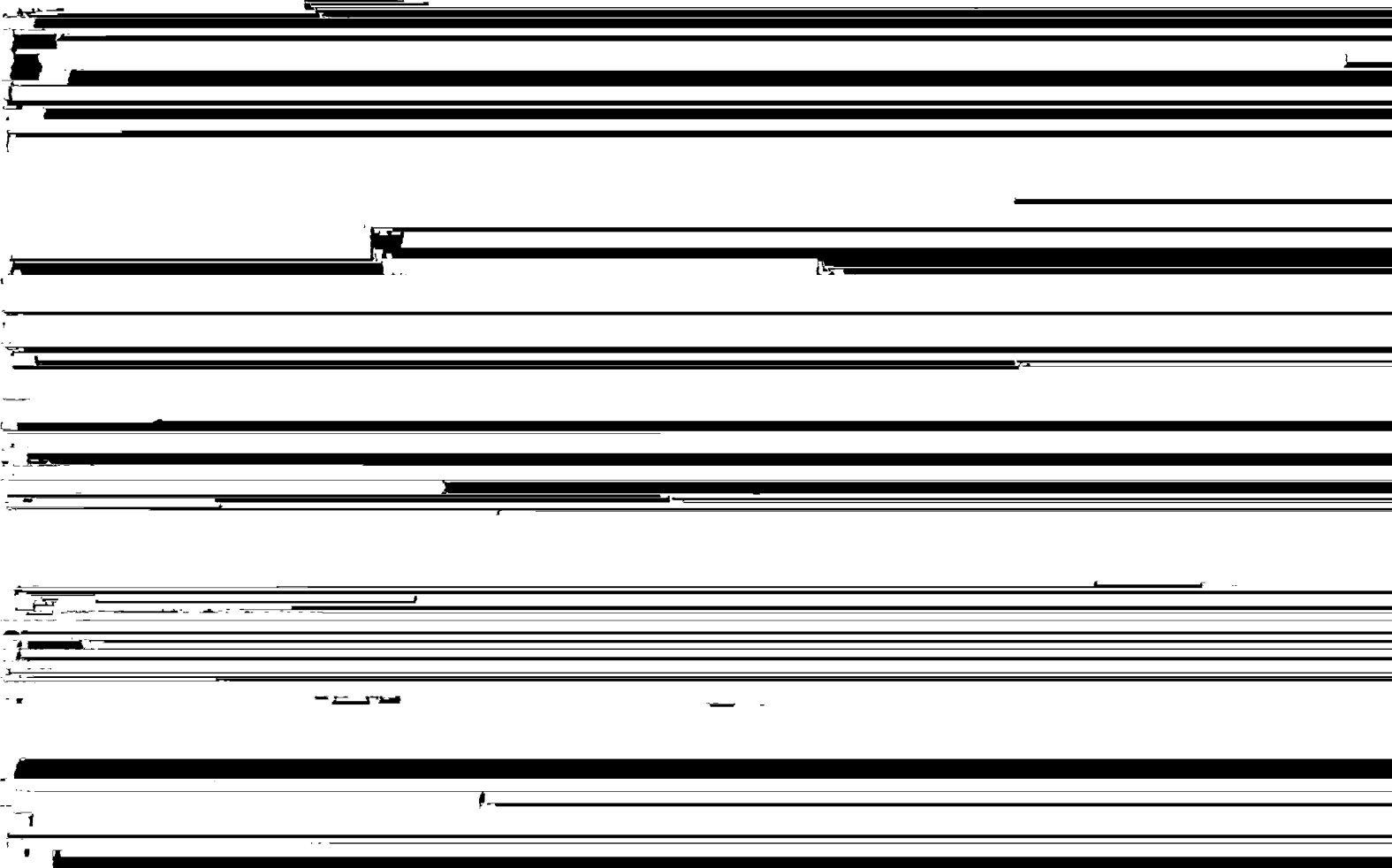
