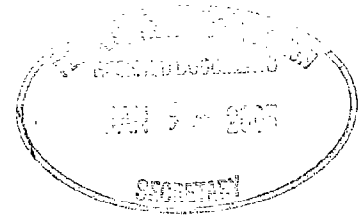

ORDER ON MOTION BY DOJ FOR
IN CAMERA TREATMENT OF DOCUMENTS

before the grand jury. DOJ requests *in camera* treatment of the documents pending conclusion of the DRAM grand jury proceedings, an undetermined period.

DOJ's motion for *in camera* treatment is premature. The Commission's Rules of Practice allow parties and third parties to seek *in camera* treatment for material *offered into evidence*, 16 C.F.R. § 3.45(b) (emphasis added). For materials that are not offered into evidence, the Commission's Rules allow parties and third parties to file a confidential version of any document,

pursuant to a protective order, 16 C.F.R. §§ 3.22(b), 3.45(e). Although it is not clear whether the information DOJ seeks to have shielded from public disclosure is subject to confidentiality protections of a protective order, DOJ asserts that the information is confidential.

It is ORDERED that DOJ's motion for *in camera* treatment is DENIED IN PART on the grounds that *in camera* treatment will not be ordered for material that is not being offered into
