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



Provide a copy of this Order to, and obtain a signed and dated acknowledgment of receipt of same from, each officer or director, each individual serving in a management capacity, all personnel involved in responding to consumer complaints or inquiries, and all sales personnel whether designated as employees, consultants, independent contractors or

acknowledgments of the receipt of copies of this Order, as required in Paragraph A of this Section.

VIII. MONITORING COMPLIANCE OF SALES PERSONNEL


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT, in connection with any business that any

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
