Proposed Respondents represent that the data contained on the six discs provided to Commission staff by letter dated June 30, 2006 represent the AHP Clinical Integration Program Database, the AHP Provider Relations Database, and the AHP Annual Clinical Integration Incentive Distribution Report referred to, respectively, at Paragraphs 1.a., 1.b., and 1.c. of Appendix 3 to the Order. Proposed Respondents further understand that they may be liable for civil penalties in the amount provided by law for each violation of the Decision and Order after the Decision and Order becomes final.
