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COMPLAINT

On July 2, 1998, the Commission received a complaint filed by Rite Aid Corporation ("Rite Aid") against The Jean-Coutu Group (PJC), Inc. ("PJC"). The complaint alleges that PJC has engaged in unfair competition by copying Rite Aid's trade dress and packaging for its own products. Rite Aid claims that PJC's actions have caused it to lose sales and damage its reputation. PJC denies the allegations and claims that its products are its own intellectual property.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Section 10(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 43(a). Rite Aid's complaint is timely because it was filed within the five-year statute of limitations period. The Commission finds that PJC's copying of Rite Aid's trade dress and packaging is an unfair competition under Section 10(a) of the FTC Act. PJC's actions have caused Rite Aid to lose sales and damage its reputation. PJC's defense is not sufficient to bar the Commission from granting relief to Rite Aid.

The Commission orders PJC to cease and desist from its unfair competition practices. PJC is also ordered to pay Rite Aid the amount of its lost sales and damages. PJC is also ordered to pay Rite Aid the amount of its reasonable attorney's fees and costs. PJC is also ordered to pay Rite Aid the amount of its reasonable expenses incurred in this matter.
