Analysis of Proposed Consent Order to Aid Public Comment In the Matter of American Telecom Services, Inc. File No. 082-3114

The Federal Trade Commission has accepted, subject to final approval, an agreement containing a consent order from American Telecom Services, Inc. ("ATS"). ATS, with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia, is a distributor of telephones and phone services.

The proposed consent order has been placed on the public record for thirty (30) days for reception of comments by interested persons. Comments received during this period will become part of the public record. After thirty (30) days, the Commission will again review the agreement and the comments received and will decide whether it should withdraw from the agreement or make final the agreement's proposed order.

This matter concerns ATS's cash rebate promotions. To make its products more attractive to retailers and their customers, ATS has offered numerous mail-in rebates ranging from \$5 to \$50 in value. In implementing these promotions, ATS used third party fulfillment houses to process and pay rebate requests received from its customers. The complaint alleges that ATS engaged in deceptive practices relating to these rebate offers.
