limited to consumer redress, and any attendant expenses for the administration of such equitable relief. In the event that direct redress to consumers is wholly or partially impracticable or funds remain after redress is completed, the Commission may apply any remaining funds for such other equitable relief (including consumer information remedies) as it determines to be reasonably related to the defendants' practices alleged in the Complaint. Any funds not used for such equitable relief shall be deposited to the U.S. Treasury as disgorgement. Defendants shall have no right to challenge the Commission's choice of remedies under this Section. Defendants shall have no right to contest the manner of distribution chosen by the Commission. No portion of funds received pursuant to this judgment shall be deemed a payment of any fine, penalty, or punitive assessment. IV. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for purposes of construction, modification, and enforcement of this Order. **SO ORDERED**, this 30th day of January, 2009 ICARDO S.
