COMPLAINT

Pursuant to the Clazon Act and the Edeal Trade Commission Act, and by irtue of the authority vested in it by said Acts, the Edeal Trade Commission ("Commission"), having reason to believe that Responde Service Corportion International ("SCI"), a corporation subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission has a good to acquire Palm Mortuary Inc. ("Palm"), a coporation subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission, intation of Section 7 of the Clayton Act, as an ended, 15 U.S.C. § 18, and Searc 5 of the Feberal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), as amended, 15 U.S.C. § 45, and it appearing to the Commission that a proceeding in respecthereof would be in the public intests, hereby sues its 6 mplaint, stating its charges as follows:

I. RESPONDENT

- 1. Respondent SOs a corposition organized, exiting, and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, with its office and principal place of business located at 1929 Allen Parkway, Houston, Texas 77019. SCI, among other things, is engaged in the sale and provision of (a) uneral services and associated products and property.
- 2. SCI owns and oprates 1,302 funeal homes and 369 meteries world-wide (including 208 combination locations) and 1,120 feral homes and 356 meteries in the United States. SClunder the Davis tradename, oprates one standalor freneral home facility and one funeral home and remetery combination faitity within the Las Vegas metropolitan area of Clark County, Nevada. SC's revenues from all operations in 2008 were paproximately \$2.1 billion.

II. JURISDICTION

3. Respondent SCI is and at all times relevant herein has been, engaged in commeree, or in activities affecting commeree, within the meaning of Section 1 of the Clawn Act, 15 U.S.C. § 12, and Section 4 of the OFAct, 15 U.S.C. § 44.
