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- 1 E. Defendant Brett Callister agrees that the facts as alleged in the Complaint filed in
2 this action shall be taken as true without further proof in any bankruptcy case or
3 subsequent civil litigation pursued by the Commission to enforce its rights to any
4 payment or money judgment pursuant to this Order including, but not limited to, a
5 nondischargeability complaint in any bankruptcy case. Defendant Brett Callister
6 further stipulates and agrees that the facts alleged in the Complaint establish all
7 elements necessary to sustain an action by the Commission pursuant to Section
8 523(a)(2)(A) of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. § 523(a)(2)(A), and that this

5 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for the purpose of monitoring defendant Brett

7 A. Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of a written request from a representative of
8 the Commission, defendant Brett Callister must submit additional compliance
9 reports or other requested information, which must be sworn under penalty of
10 perjury; appear for depositions; and produce documents for inspection and
11 copying. The Commission is also authorized to obtain discovery, without further
12 leave of court, using any of the procedures prescribed by Federal Rules of Civil
13 Procedure 29, 30 (including telephonic depositions), 31, 33, 34, 36, 45, and 69;

14 B. For matters concerning this Order, the Commission is authorized to communicate
IS directly with defendant Brett Callister. Defendant Brett Callister must permit
16 representatives of the Commission to interview any employee or other person
17 affiliated with him who has agreed to such an interview. The person interviewed
18 may have counsel present; and

23 majority owner or directly or indirectly controls, must deliver a copy of this Order
24 to: (1) all principals, officers, directors, and managers; (2) all employees, agents,
25 and representatives who participate in conduct related to the subject matter of the
26 Order; and (3) any business entity resulting from any change in structure as set
27 forth in the Section titled "Compliance Reporting." Delivery must occur with
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1 seven (7) days of entry of this Order for current personnel. To all others, delivery
2 must occur before they assume their responsibilities and

3 c. From each individual or entity to which defendant Brett Callister delivered a copy
4 of this Order, he must obtain, within thirty (30) days, a signed and dated
5 acknowledgment of receipt of this Order.

7 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for
8 purposes of construction, modification, and enforcement of this Order.
