Analysis of Proposed Consent Order to Aid Public Comment In the Matter of CarePatrol, Inc., File No. 1123155

The Federal Trade Commission ("Commission") has accepted, subject to find approval, an agreement containing conset order from CarePatrol, hc. ("CarePatrol" or "responder").

The proposed consent ordehas been placed on the publicercoid for thirty (30) days for receipt of comments by interested persons. Comments received during this period will become part of thepublic record. After thirty (30) days, the Commission will again review the agreement and the comments recised, and will deide whethe it should withdraw from the agreement or make the proposed order final.

The matterinvolves cetain statements Carretrol has made immernet advetising regardingits placement swices forseniors requiring long term care in assisted living facilities ("A LFs") and othe non-nusing homefacilities servicing the frail elderly. According to the Commission's complaint, Care Patrol matthe following false and unsubstantiated claims: (a) that it moritors or grades the care history and violations of virtually all or a substantial majority of ALFs in a consumer's desired location; (b) that its senior carconsultants erlocated in every state; and (athat its monitoring or reading of assisted living accilities is based on reeview of the facilities' most recent state inspetion reports. Thus, the complaint states that Care Patrolsha engaged in deceptive practices in violation of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act.

The proposed ordercontains four provisions designated prevent Care Patrol, or other persons whome in active concert or paticipation with it, from engging in similar acts and practices in the future Part IA.1 of the proposed ordeprohibits responded from misrepresenting or makingunsubstantiated presentations, that it has morbited or evaluated a number, portion, or preentage of the assisted living failities in a consumers' desired location.

Part IA.2 prohibits CarePatrol orm misrepresetting ormakingunsubstantiated representations that itor its franchisees provide lacement services through a network of officers, agents, employees ad contractors who are located in any geographic region.

Part IA.3 prohibits CarePatrolorm claiming thatits monitoring orgrading of assisted living facilities is based on a view of information contained in state inspieco reports, or may other records detailing the performance of assisted living facilities, unless the daim is non-misleading and base on competent red reliable evidence. It also require such claims to be based upon the most recent inspection reports.

Finally, Part IB prohibits CarePatrol from making false or unsubstantiate representations regarding its placement services.

Parts I through V of the poposed orderequire CaePatrol to: keepopies of advetisements and mater's relied upon in disseminating yrepresentation covered by the order, provide copie of the ordeto certain personnel, agents, and persentatives having supervisory responsibilities with respect to the subjectatter of the order; notify the Commission of changes in its structure that ming affect compliance obligations under the order and file acompliance epot with the Commission and respond to other quests form FTC staff Part VI provides that the der will terminate after twenty (20) years, with certain exceptions.

The purpose of this analysis is to facilitate public comment on the proposed order. It is not intended to constitute an official interpretation of the complaint or the proposed order, or to modify the proposed order's terms in any way.
