COMPLAINT

Pulsuant to the provisions of the Federal Trade Commission Act, as amended, 15 U.S.C. § 41 et seq. and byvirtue of the athority vested in it bysaid Act, the Edeal Trade Commission ("Commission"), having reason to bleeve that Neman Marcus Group, file. ("Neiman Macus" or "respondent") ha violated the provisions of the Feal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 4dt seq, the FurProducts labeling Act, 15 U.S.C. § 69 t seq, and the Rules and Regulations Under the Fur Products Labeling Act, 16 C.F.R.

4. In May 2009, Commission staff closedmainvestigation into whether respondent Neiman Marcus had falsely advertised coats as having faux fur that in fact contained real fur. In closing the investigation, staff elied in patr on respondents' assurances that it had reached an agreement with a third-patry vendor to lableproducts as containing either real fur or other material.

CONDUCT

5. From approximately October5, 2009, until approximately November16, 2012, respondent disseminated, or caused to be disseminated, advertisements for fur products, including, but not limited to, a Biberry Outerwear Jacket ("Outerwear Jacket), a Stuart Weitzman Ballerina Flat ("Ballerina Flat"), and an Alice + Olivia Kyah Faux-Fur Collar Coat ("Kyah Coat")

Outerwear Jacket False Advertising

6. From approximately October5, 2009, until October 30, 2009 spendent disseminated, or caused to be disseminated, the advertisement attached as Exhibit A. This advertisement from www.neimanmarcus.com contained the following statements (emphasis added):

Outerwear Jacket

Cardinal red. Allover quilted topstitchingBlack faux-fur hood with snap-tab detail; zipśnap font. Longsleeves with zip cuff detail. Tonal belt at natura waist. Zip pockets. A-line. Poester/polyamide. Madein Italy of imported material.

- 7. The Outewear Jacket had an attabed labedisclosing that it in fatocontained "ed fur."
- 8. From October5, 2009, until October 30, 2009spendent sold at least fiveu@rwear Jackets via its website for total revenue of a least \$6,475.

Ballerina Flat False Advertising

9. From approximately August 3, 2011, untilapproximately December 1, 2011, responded disseminated, oracused to be disseminated, the advisement attaced as Exhibit B. This advertisement from www.neimanmarcus.com contained the following statements (emphasis added):

A cute fur ornament decoates the toef this basic balleina flat by Stuart Weitzman.

Sport suede upper

Faux fur (cotton/viscose)pom on round toe. Imported of Spanish and Italian material.

Respondent's www.bergdorfgoodman.com interntesite carried a similar advæisement beginning on August 20, 2011.

10. From approximately August 14, 2011, until approximately December 1, 2011, responded disseminated, oracused to be disseminated, the tadog advetisement for the Billerina Flat attached a Exhibit C, which contained the following statements (rephasis added)

Black or cola "Furball" ballet flat with dyed mink (Spain) pouf, wibber sole, rad 1/2" wedge heel.

- 11. From approximately November 27, 2011, until approximately December 1, 2011, responder mailed to its customers a "steff attache as Exhibi D that descibed the product as containing "dyed mink (Spain) pouf" (emphasis added).
- 12. The vendor of the Ballerina Flat had notified responded that the productor tained real rabbit furbefore July 25, 2011.
- 13. From approximately August 3 to December 1, 2011, sepondent sold at least 292 Ballerina Flats via its websites, catalog, and mailers for a total revenue of at least \$85,000.

Kyah Coat False Advertising

14. From approximately August 9, 2012, untilapproximately November 16, 2012, respondent disseminated, or cased to be disseminated, tandevetisement attachdess Exhibit E. This advertisement of m www.neimanmacus.com contained theoflowing statements (emphasis added):

Kyah Faux Fur-Collar Coat: Glam uppyr professional looks with the Alice + Olivia Kyah coa, which features a plushfaux-fur collar.

Crepe with faux-fur (polyester/viscos) collar.

Sef-tie waist.

Long slæves.

Arched hem alls below hip.

Virgin wool/cashmer/eolyester.

Dry clean.

Imported.

15. The Kyah Coat hadraattache label disclosing that its collar was in fat "real fur."

16. From approximately August 9, 2012, untilapproximately November 16, 2012, respondent sold at least 19 Kyah Coats via its website for a total revenue of at least \$15,162.

COUNT I

- 17. Through the means decribed in Paargraphs 6, 9, rad 14, responded represented, expresslyor by implication, that the fur in the Outweer Jacket, Pallerina Flat, and Kyah Coat was fax or fake. In truth and in fatic those products conitrated real fur. Therefore, the representations set forth in Pareagons 6, 9, rad 14 were false, deeptive, or misleading.
- 18. Through the means described in Paragraphs 10 and 11, respondent represented, expressly or by implication, that the fur in the Bellerina Flat was mink fur. In truth and in fatic the Ballerina Flat contained arbbit fur. Therefore, there presentations set forth in Paragraphs 10 and 11 were false, deceptive, or misleading.
- 19. Respondent's pratices, a alleged in this complaint, constitute unfair oroseptive acts or practices in or affecting commercein violation of Section 5(a) of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a)nd false alvertising in violation of Section 5(a) of the Fur Products abeling Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 69c)(5), and Sections 301.2(and 301.49 of the Rules and Regulations Under the Fur Products Labeling Act, 16 CF.R. §§ 301.2(c) and 301.49. Pursuant to Sections 30(a) 3(c) of the Fur Products labeling Act, 15 U.S.C. § 69a)(and 69(c)), the false advetising of fur products, within the meaning of the Fur Products labeling Act and the Rules and Regulations Under Fur Products Labeling Act, is unlawful and an unfair and deceptive act or practice, in commerce, under the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 4 to 15

COUNT II

- 20. Through the means described in paragraphs 6, 9-11, and 14, respondent did not disclose the name of the animal that proded the fur in the Outewear Jacket, Ballerina Flat, and Kyah Coat as seorth in the FurProducts Name (Gde, 16 C.F.R. § 301.0.
- 21. Through the means described in paragraphs 6, 9, and 14, respondinted did not disclose the country of origin for the fur in the Outerwear Jacket, Ballerina Flat, and Kyah Coat.
- 22. Respondent's pratices, a alleged in this complaint, constitute unfair orodeptive acts or practices in or affecting commercein violation of Section 5(a) of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a)nd false alvertisingin violation of Sections 5(a), 5(a)(5), and 5(a)(6) of the FurProducts labelingAct, 15 U.S.C. § 69c)(a),(5), and (6), and Sections 301.2(c) and 301.49 of the Rules and Regulations Under the Fur Products LabelingAct, 16 C.F.R. §§ 301.2)(and 301.49. Pursuato Sections 3(a)nd 3(c) of the FurProducts labelingAct, 15 U.S.C. § 69a)(and 69(c)), the false advettising of fur products, within the meaning the Fur Products labelingAct and the Rules and

Regulations Under Fir Products labelingAct, is unlawful and an unfar and deceptive act orpradice, in commerce, unde the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 41, et seq.
