the company to use geophysical location tracking technology, provided that consumers receive notice of and give their consent to its use, and that computer users receive notice immediately prior to its activation. This notice requirement may be suspended where the consumer reports the computer stolen – or there is otherwise a reasonable basis to believe that the computer has been stolen – and a police report is filed. This provision provides Aspen Way with an effective means to locate and retrieve stolen computers.

In light of these considerations, the Commission has determined that the public interest would best be served by issuing the Decision ~~and~~ in final form without any modifications.
