Re: Acquisition of LLC Interest

Dear Mike:

We have had several discussions about a transaction whereby our client "A," which owns 50% of an LLC called "C", proposes to buy "B's" 50% interest in "C."

As we discussed, "A" filed an HSR notification in mid-1996 to acquire assets used in an ongoing business. In that filing "A" stated that those assets would be acquired directly by "A"

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Under the 1999 LLC Interpretation servon and I discussed "A" may literally be

acquisition by "A" of "B's" 50% LLC interest in "C." This is based upon our representation that the assets of "C" are substantially the same as they were in 1996 when "A" filed the HSR

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Notification mentioned above and that "C" has not made any acquisitions during this period (other than in the ordinary course of its business).

Please let me know as soon as possible if this letter does not accurately represent our conversations and the FTC's conclusion that, in these circumstances, "A" and "B" are not
