The MOU formalizes and will enhance the already excellent relations between the U.S. and Indian authorities. It provides a framework for future cooperation based on our shared interests in sound enforcement and a recognition that it may be useful to cooperate in investigations of the same matter and collaborate on policy matters. After all, so much commerce is global and so much of antitrust policy is in the process of converging among nations.

Our mutual exchanges over the past decade have come at a time of tremendous growth in the Indian economy and its commitment to competition policy. We have been delighted to witness Indian competition policy develop a higher profile both within India and abroad, and remain a partner and friend, willing to provide input and assistance to contribute to the further evolution of sound and effective competition enforcement and policy in India.

Today we come together to celebrate a milestone in the relationships among our agencies and, meaningfully, we do so with the strong endorsement of our Department of State and your embassy in Washington.
