1. Names, addresses, and telephonembers of all individual agency components and offices that receive FOIA requests.

Regardless of how submitted (via mail, fax, or e-mail) requests should be addressed as follows:

- j. Median Number the middle, not average, number. For example, of 3, 7, and 14, the median number is 7.
- k. Multi-Track Processing a system in which simple requests requiring relatively minimal review are placed in one-oppessing track and more voluminous and complex requests are placed in one or more other tracks. Requests granted expedited processing are place in yet bentrack. Requests in each track are processed on a first in/first out basis.
  - i. Expedited Processing- an agency will process a FOIA request on an expedited basis when a requesters the requirements for expedited processing as set forth in the text and in agency regulations.
  - ii. Simple Request—a FOIA request that an agency using multi-track processing places in its fastest (repredited) track based on the low volume and/or simplicity of the records requested.
