Thank you for your comment on the Federal Trade Commission's consent agreement in the above-entitled proceeding. The Commission has placed your comment on the public record pursuant to rule 4.9(b)(6)(ii) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 4.9(b)(6)(ii), and has given it serious consideration.

In your comment, you express concerns about your child making unauthorized purchases on Apple devices. The proposed complaint and order here should help to address your concern. The proposed complaint alleges that Apple failed to obtain account holders' informed consent for in-app charges incurred by children. Under the proposed order, Apple must alter its business practices going forward to obtain express, informed consent to in-app charges before billing for such charges.
