- 1. Respondent Par Petroleum Corporation is a corporation organized, existing, ragnd doi business under, and by virtue of, the laws of the State of Delaware, with its corporate office and principal place of business located at 800 Gessner Road, Suite 875, Houston, Texas 77010.
- 2. The Federal Trade Commission has jurisdiction of the subject matter of this proceeding and of the Respondeand the proceeding is in the public interest.

ORDER

Ι.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, as used in this Order, the following definitions shall apply:

A. "Respondent" means Par Petroleum Corporation, its disecutives, employees, agents, representatives, successors, and assigns; and the subsidiaries, divisions, groups,

B. The prior notification required by this Paragraph III. shall be given on the Notification and Report Form set forth in the Appendix to Part 803 of Title 16 of the Code of Federal Regulations as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Notification"), and shall be prepared and transmitted in accordance with the requirements of that part, except that no filing fee will be required for any such notification, notification shall be filed with the Secretary of the Commission, notification need not be made to the United States Department of Justice, and notification is required only of the Respondent and not of any other party to the transaction. Respondent shall provide the Notification to the Commission at leashirty (30) days prior to consummating the transaction (hereinafter referred to as the "first waiting period"). If, within the first waiting period, representatives of the Commission make a written request for additional information or documentary materi (within the meaning of 16 C.F.R. § 803.20), Respondent shall not consummate the transaction until thirty (30) days after submitting such additional information or documentary material. Early termination of the waiting periods in this Paragraph III. may be requested and, where appropriate, granted by letter from the Bureau of Competition. Provided, however, that prior notification shall not be required by this Paragraph for a transaction for which notification is required to be made, and has been madepursuant to Section 7A of the Clayton Act, 15 U.S.C. § 18a.

IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall file a verified written report with the Commission setting forth in detail the manner and form in which it intends to comply, is complying, and has complied with this Order no later than (i) thirty (30) days from the date this Order is issued; and (ii)ne (1) year after the date this Order is issued annually thereafter until this Order terminates, and at such other times asother@ssion staff may request.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall notify the Commission at least thirty (30) days prior to:

- A. Any proposed dissolution of Respondent;
- B. Any proposed acquisition, merger, or consolidation of Respondent; or

C. Any other change in the Respondent, including, but not limited to, assignment and the creation or dissolution of subsidiaries, if such change might affect compliance obligations arising out of the Order.

VI.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for the purpose of determining or securing compliance with this Order, and subject to any legally recognized privilege, and upon written request and upon five (5) days' notice to Respondent, Respondent shall, without restraint or interference, permit any duly authorized respondent of the Commission:

- A. Access, during business office hours of the Responsible in the presence of counsel, to all facilities and access to inspect and copy all books, ledgers, accounts, correspondence, memoranda and all lower records and documents in the possession, or under the control of the Respondentelated to compliance with this Order, which copying services shall be provided by the Respondent at its xpense; and
- B. To interview officers, directes, or employees of the Respondent, who may have counsel present, regarding such matters.
