COMPLAINT

The Federal Trade Commission, having reason to believe that Dale Jarrett Racing Adventure, Inc., & Corporation, haviolated the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), and it appearing to the Commission that this proceeding is in the public interest, alleges:

- 1. Respondent Dale Jarrett Racing Adventure, Isa, Floridacorporation with its principal office or place of business at 116 Street NW, Suite 302, Hickory, North Carolina 28601.
- 2. Respondent is race cardriving school that offers consumers an opportunity to ride in and drive genuine stock cars with professional drivetswas founded by ASCAR champion Dale Jarrett.

transfer of personal data outside the EU, with exceptions, unle**Esitope**ean Commission ("EC") has made a determination that the recipient jurisdiction's laws ensure the protection of such personal dataThis determination is referred to commoalsymeeting the EU's "adequacy" standard.

- 6. To satisfy the EU adequacy standard for certain commercial transfers, the U.S. Department of Commerce ("Commerce") and the EC negotiated the EUSSafe Harbor Framework, which went into effect in 2000. The U.SU Safe HarboFrameworkallows U.S. companies to transfer personal datafully from the EU. To join the U.SEU Safe Harbor Framework a company must settertify to Commerce that it complies with seven principles and related requirements that have been deemed to meet the EU's adequacy standard.
- 7. Companies under the jurisdioon of the U.S. Federal Trade Commission ("FTC"), as well as the U.S. Department of Transportation, are eligible to join the EUSSafe Harbor Framework A company under the FTC's jurisdiction that claims it has continued to the Safe Harbor principes, but failed to selfcertify to Commercemay be subject to an enforcement action based on the FTC's deception authority under Section 5 of the FTC Act.
- 8. Commerce maintains a public website, www.export.gov/safehawhere it posts the names of companes that have selfertified to the U.SEU Safe HarboFramework. The listing of companies indicatewhether their selfertification is "current" or "not current" and a date when recertification is due. Companies are required-toe metry every year inorder to retain their status as "current" members of the Safe Harbor Framework.

Violations of Section 5 of the FTC Act

 Since at least January 2015, respondent has disseminated or caused to be disseminated privacy policies and statements on the http://www.racingadventure.com/privacy.html website, including, but not lirted to, the following statement

Dale Jarrett Racing adventure adheres to the US Safe Harbor
