

AGREEMENT CONTAINING

The Federal Trade Commission ("Commission") has conducted an investigation of certain acts and practices of ReadyTech Corporation ("Proposed Respondent"). The Commission's Complaint ("Complaint") or ("CBCP") Response Respondent, through its Agent, has filed this Consent Order with the Commission. The Commission has approved this Consent Agreement.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED by and between Proposed Respondent and BC&T:

1. Proposed Respondent ReadyTech Corporation is a California corporation with its principal office or place of business at 2201 Broadway, Suite 725, Oakland, CA 94612.
2. Proposed Respondent neither admits nor denies any allegations in the Complaint, except as specifically stated in the Decision and Order. Only for purposes of this action, Proposed Respondent admits the facts necessary to establish jurisdiction.
3. Proposed Respondent agrees:
  - A. Any further procedural steps;
  - B. The requirement that the Commission

does not constitute final approval, but it serves as the basis for further actions leading to final disposition of the matter. Hereafter, the Commission may either withdraw its acceptance of this Consent Agreement and so notify Proposed Respondent, in which event the Commission will take such action as it may consider appropriate, or issue and serve its Complaint (in such form as the circumstances may require) and decision in disposition of the proceeding, which may include an Order. See Section 2.34 of the Commission's Rules, 16 C.F.R. § 2.34.

5. If this agreement is accepted by the Commission, and if such acceptance is not subsequently withdrawn by the Commission pursuant to Commission Rule 2.34, the Commission may, without further notice to Proposed Respondent (1) issue its Complaint corresponding in form and substance with the attached draft Complaint and its Decision and Order; and (2) make information about them public. Proposed Respondent agrees that service of the Order may be effected by its publication on the Commission's website (ftc.gov), at which time the Order will become final. See Rule 2.32(d). Proposed Respondent waives any rights it may have to any other manner of
