COMPLAINT

The Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”), having reason to believe that Medable, Inc., a corporation violated the Federal Trade Commission Act (“FTC Act”), and it appearing to the Commission that this proceeding is in the public interest, alleges:

6. The EU-U.S. Privacy Shield framework (“Privacy Shield”) was designed by the U.S. Department of Commerce (“Commerce”) and the European Commission to provide a mechanism for U.S. companies to transfer personal data outside of the EU that is consistent with the requirements of the European Union Directive on Data Protection. Enacted in 1995, the Directive sets forth EU requirements for privacy and the protection of personal data. Amongst the requirements are that the recipient of the data must provide adequate protection for the data.

THEREFORE, the Federal Trade Commission this sixth day of January 2020, has issued this complaint against Respondent.
