Upon consideration of the Federal Trademonission's Unopposed Petition for an Order Governing Compliance with Civil Investigative Demands Issued in Furtherance of a Law Enforcement Investigation, the supporting deadien from Thomas J. Widor, and memorandum of law, this Court finds thathe civil investigative demands (COs) to Apollo Education Group, Inc. and the University of Phoenix, Inc. awithin the lawful authority granted to the Commission by Congress, were issued in accordant procedural requirements, and seek evidence that is relevant and material to the sitingation. The Court further finds that the CIDs at issue constitute "subpoena[s] issuecafoarw enforcement purpose" and that good cause

warrants an order requiring the Companies toply with the CIDs without providing notice prior to disclosure pursuant to 20 UCS§§ 1232g(b)(1)(J)(ii)and 1232g(b)(2)(B).

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondents Apollo Education Group, Inc. and the University of Phoenix, Inc. shall complyith the Commission's CIDby producing responsive "education records," as that term is defined 100 U.S.C. § 1232g(a)(4), subject to any remaining defenses and privileges;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT such production shall commence within fourteen (14) days from the date of this @r and be completed within sixty (60) days of the date of this Order, or at such later time(s) as may be ed upon by the parties, subject to any remaining defenses and privileges; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Apollo Education Group, Inc., University of Phoenix, Inc., and any of their officers, direstæmployees, agents, or attorneys shall comply with the Commission's CIDs whit disclosing to any person the contents of the civil investigative demands or any education records shed in response the civil investigative demands.
