Dear Mr. Unglesbee:

This is in response to your request dated October 13, 2016 under the Freedom of Information Act seeking access to consumer complaints concerning FleetCor Technologies and Regents Bank. In accordance with the FOIA and agency policy, we have searched our records as of October 13, 2016, the date we received your request in our FOIA office.

The Commission's fee regulations specify that fees do not exceed \$25. 16 C.F.R. § 4.8(b)(4). Because the fees associated with the processing of your request did not exceed \$25, we have processed your request free of charge.

We have located 218 of responsive complaints that consumers have made to the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC"). You should know that the names of complainants have not necessarily been verified by the FTC. Therefore, you should make your own judgment about relying on the information provided. Providing access to consumers' names and addresses, and any other identifying information found in the complaints. This information is exempt from release under FOIA Exemption 4, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4), because it would likely to privacy of our citizens and the general public's interest in seeing personal identifying information. See *The Latin Law Firm v. FTC*, 352 F.3d 1122 (7th Cir. 2005). In addition, some responsive records constitute confidential commercial or financial information, which is exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 4, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4).

If you are not satisfied with this response to your request, you may appeal by writing to Freedom of Information Act Appeal, Office of the General Counsel, Federal Trade Commission, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20580, within 90 days of the date of this letter. Please include a copy of your original request and a copy of this response. If you believe that we should choose to disclose additional materials beyond what the FOIA requires, please explain why this would be in the public interest.
