

Remarks of Honorable Robert E. Freer to the graduating class on the occasion of the Second graduation exercises of the Honeywell Foundation, Bethesda, Maryland, Saturday June 4, 1949.

These words of "Poor Richard" were painted on the wall of one of the classrooms of a very respected eastern college when the building was erected sometime around 1870. They exercised, no doubt, a large influence on somewhere near twenty thousand graduates of that college before whose eyes they appeared.
