Proposed Respondent greet hat service of the Order may be effected its publication on the Commission's website (ftc.gov) watch time the Order will become final. See Rule 2.32(d). Proposed Respondent waives any rights they may have to a my author of service. See Rule 4.4.
- 6. When final, the Decision and Ordewill have the same force and effect and may be altered, modified, or set aside in the same manner and within the same time provided by statute for other Commission orders.
- 7. The Complaint may be used in construing the terms deficient and OrderNo agreement, understanding, representation, or interpretation not contained in the Decision and Orderor in thisConsent Agreement may be used to vary or contradict the terms of the Decision and Order.
- 8. Proposed Respondent agrees to comply with the terms of the proposed Decision and Order, Proposed Respondent understatings it may be liable for civil penalties and other relief for each violation of the Decision and Order after it becomes final.
